The programme is based on feedback from Student Councils and Student and Parent Surveys and includes some exciting new opportunities.

It offers a wide range of over 60 clubs, activities and opportunities across the Reception to Year 11 age range and we aim to offer something to interest everyone!

Student Leadership opportunities was one of the 6 Key Priorities for last academic year and the new ECA programme includes many opportunities for Seniors Students to support, coach, mentor and lead activities and working groups. This helps our young people to build up their digital portfolio of leadership experience and skills which gives them the 'Webber Edge' and helps them stand out in their Prefect, Head Student, Post 16 Sixth Form and College interviews. These opportunities give our students the chance to serve in their School and wider community and to give something back. These leadership opportunities also help our young people to develop as individuals to become confident, articulate and impactful young adult and contribute toward their Community Service Awards.

- **Step 1** please follow the link to magic booking https://webberindependentschool.magicbooking.co.uk or click https://webberindependentschool.magicbooking.co.uk or c
- **Step 2** (if you do not have an account) click 'Forgot your password?' button, enter your email address to receive a link to reset your password.

Please note this must be the same email address that we hold on the School system, you will not be able to use any other email. If this needs updating, please contact the Admin Team on reception@webberindependentschool.co.uk


- **Step 3** (if you do not have an account) you will then receive a link to reset your password once this is done you will now have access to the system.
- **Step 4** select the type of activity you would like to book.
- **Step 5** follow the steps on screen and make sure to answer questions where appropriate.
- **Step 6** please ensure to make payment(s) at the time of booking where necessary to ensure your booking does not get cancelled by the system.

Waiting List Check

Step 7 – Double check whether your child is on the Activity or the Waiting List by clicking the 'Bookings' tab at the top of the page.



Step 8 – Scroll to the bottom, this will show you all the activities you have signed your child up for however, this **does not mean they are accepted.** The 'balance' column refers to any outstanding amount to pay so in the example below all money is 'cleared' meaning there is no money left to pay.



Step 9 – Click on the 'View Booking' button in the very right hand column to view the status of the booking.



Step 10 - If the activity is confirmed it will say 'Accepted' in green however, if you are on the Waiting List it will say 'Waiting List' in blue.



To ensure your child can attend their preferred ECAs, we recommend you book early as capacity in each club may be limited.

The children will be expected to commit to the club for the whole term.

Clubs will commence Tuesday 16 April 2024.

If you are booking Extra Curricular Activities and require After School Provision after the Activity, please ensure to book the appropriate After School Provision event using the same link as above. I have added a note to the title of the event to make it more convenient. For our newer parents Before and After School Provision is booked the same way as above.

Dungeons and Dragons is a role – playing game (RPG) that allows each player to create their own fantasy character, and their character embarks upon adventures within the Forgotten Realms fantasy setting. A Dungeon Master (DM) serves as the game's referee and storyteller, while maintaining the setting in which the adventures occur, and playing the role of the inhabitants of the game world, known as non- player characters (NPCs).

The characters' form an adventuring group and they interact with the setting's inhabitants and each other. Together they solve dilemmas, engage in battles, explore, and gather treasure and knowledge. In the process, the characters earn experience points (XP) to rise in levels, and become increasingly powerful over a series of separate gaming sessions.

Some prior knowledge is helpful but not necessary.
