

First Aid

This program will include both theoretical instruction and hands-on practical sessions.

A.A.M.S (Acute Ambulance & Medical Services) will issue a certificate upon successful completion of the course, which will cover the following key areas:

- · Management of life-threatening bleeding
- Anaphylaxis response (including the use of auto-injectors)
- Basic care for seizures
- Basic care for asthma (including inhaler usage)
- Basic wound care
- Basic Life Support (BLS), including the use of a manikin

The course is structured into weekly sessions, with each week focusing on a specific topic. For example, one week may be dedicated to Basic Life Support, while another may focus on life-threatening bleeding.

Participants—particularly children—will have the opportunity to engage in practical training, including the use of BLS techniques and AED (Automated External Defibrillator) practice. Given the time required for effective hands-on learning, one full session may be allocated exclusively to BLS and AED. The remaining sessions will then incorporate the other topics, ensuring a comprehensive and engaging learning experience.
